Dear Parents and Carers,

Firstly, I hope this finds you and your families well.

I am emailing with an update on the work the school has been involved with in the development of our behaviour curriculum and approach.

Following a long period of work, alongside the Trust and other education-based research, we have developed our approach in order to teach and support all pupils with behaviour.

Underpinning all of the work is the school vision and its Rainbow Values. We still have and use the guide of, 'Ready, Respectful, Safe' which reminds all pupils about appropriate behaviours.

However, taking this further, we have developed an agreed set of routines and systems which will promote a calm, purposeful and supportive environment in school.

Each area of learning has a set of expectations which we are working on as a school.

In addition to this, we have also looked at the consequence system should we encounter behaviour which is negative or inappropriate. This behaviour consequence system is also included in the document as an appendix.

As it states at the beginning of the document, we are all jointly responsible for supporting our children at Archbishop Wake in learning and developing appropriate behaviours and it is important that as the primary carers for your children, we work together in order to support positive outcomes as each child learns and grows.

Please take some time to discuss with your child/ren the routines outlined above, as well as looking at the document online. It is also important to note that this document is going to evolve in time - we have more to do and more detail to add in time.
