

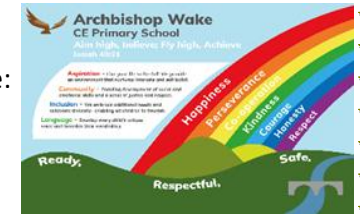

Year 6 Curriculum Overview - Summer Term 2025

Our values for this term are:

Honesty and Respect

Why is fair trade fair? Is historical evidence always true?

History: **Beyond face value**

The children will be completing a series of enquiries looking at the way powerful people have manipulated evidence and have tried to persuade others of their version of the past. The case studies explore the Tudors, Victorian Britain and Life in Britain during World War Two.

Geography: **Fair Trade**

We will be exploring what international trade entails - the manufacture, selling and buying of goods and services between countries through exports and imports - and the fact that trade has been operating for thousands of years.

DT: The children will complete a project linked to electrical systems and develop their knowledge of switches and circuits.

Art: The children will develop their understanding of 3D modelling.

RE:

Islam: Does belief in Akhirah help Muslims lead a good life?

Kingdom of God (understanding Christianity) What kind of King is Jesus?

English:

Reading:

The children will be reading the novel 'Orphans of the Tide' by Struan Murray as both their class reader and guided reading book.

The children will also read a range of non-fiction texts, which will explore inspirational people and current affairs

Writing:

This term, the children will consolidate their understanding of different grammatical concepts. They will be focusing on writing diary entries.

Maths:

Geometry, position and direction

Consolidation and themed projects

The children will develop their problem solving and reasoning skills through completion of a range of projects. These projects will provide an opportunity to revisit many of the skills and curriculum content covered both in Year 6 and also the rest of Key Stage 2. The projects will explore maths in real life contexts, allowing children to see how important maths is in all aspects of life.

In addition to this, the children will continue to develop their fluency skills focusing on developing their understudying of how to be efficient, accurate and flexible.

Ways to help at home:

- Reading with your child 3 times a week.
- Practising times tables and spellings at home.
- Encourage your child to access online, educational apps to practise key skills.

Science:

Animals including humans

The children will develop their understanding of the skeletal, muscular and digestive system and learn how to keep their bodies healthy.

Living things and their habitats

The children will explore how living things can be classified according to characteristics.

French:

We will use the Niveau Tricolore scheme and be looking at 'Myself and my Family'. These units will focus on describing ourselves, clothes and the weather.

Music: **Music and Me**

The children will try out different ways of making their own music, while exploring the work of some of the most influential women in music over the last 100 years.

PE:

Our weekly PE and games lessons will focus on athletics, rounders and tennis.

Computing:

Spreadsheets and sensing

The children will develop their coding skills using micro:bits.
